

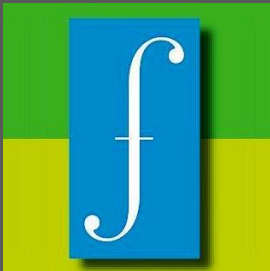


Prague's Top 5 Festivals 2012



Prague State Opera / February 25 PRAGUE OPERA BALL
