HISTORY

FROM WETTIN ROOTS TO A LUXURY HOTEL

In 1705, Augustus the Strong, Elector of Saxony and later King of Poland, commissioned his master builder, Daniel Pöppelmann, to construct a magnificent city palace. He gifted it to his mistress, Anna Constantia, Countess of Cosel. Following her fall from favour in 1713, the palace became the residence of Saxon electoral princes and their families from 1718 onwards. Throughout the 18th and 19th centuries, the palace was home to many notable figures, including descendants of Augustus the Strong, such as Augustus III, King of Poland and Grand Duke of Lithuania, and Luise of Austria-Tuscany, beloved by the citizens of Dresden.

The Taschenbergpalais also inspired artists and patrons of the time. Among them was Princess Amalie of Saxony, born in the palace and a

great-great-granddaughter of Augustus the Strong. In the mid-19th century, she composed several operas and comedies within its walls. Although the building suffered severe damage during the air raids on Dresden in February 1945, remnants of the palace remained a part of the city's silhouette for decades. Reconstruction began in 1993, and on 31 March 1995, the Hotel Taschenbergpalais Kempinski Dresden opened as Saxony's first five-star luxury hotel. In August 2002, the catastrophic flooding in Saxony affected the Taschenbergpalais, prompting a year-long partial renovation. From 2023 to 2024, the hotel underwent extensive refurbishment of its rooms, suites and public areas, giving it a refreshed yet historically faithful design – ready once again to shine.

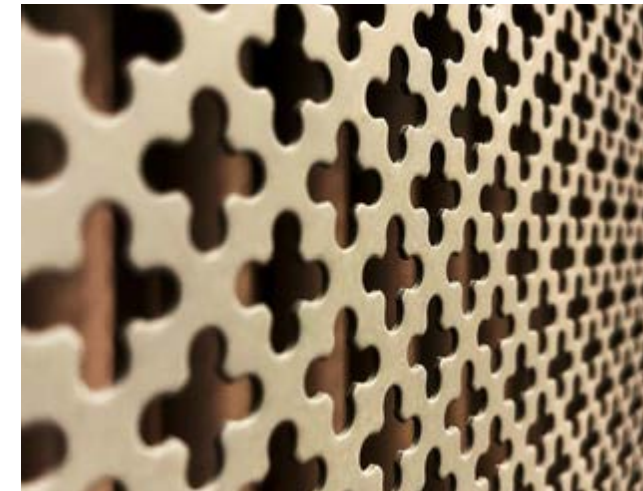

— RENOVATION —

A NEW ROYAL CHARME

Since its grand opening in 1995, the Hotel Taschenbergpalais Kempinski Dresden has set new standards for luxury hospitality. Between January 2023 to mid-2024, the hotel underwent a comprehensive renovation to elevate its timeless appeal.

The lobby, rooms and suites and the café were completely redesigned, while modern technical systems were integrated, with a strong focus on sustainability.

The result is an aesthetic masterpiece, shaped by the skills of designers, artists and architects. Renowned designer Markus Hilzinger drew inspiration from Dresden's cultural landmarks, creating a design that marries contemporary elegance with regal splendour. His vision honours the legacy of Augustus the Strong

and the Saxon history while embracing the expectations of a modern luxury hotel. Finest craftsmanship is reflected in the use of premium materials and the integration of custom-made furnishings and fabrics.

The new rooms and suites now feature three distinct colour schemes— Historic Blue, Sage Green and Sandstone Beige – each creating a unique atmosphere. The choice of wall designs – ranging from structural and invigorating to artistic and geometric – adds character and depth to each space.

A balanced lighting concept with atmospheric highlights enhances the spacious interiors with harmony and elegance, creating an environment of refined luxury.

With a diverse culinary offering, from the Amalie Pâtisserie & Lounge to Bar 1705 and several event spaces, the Taschenbergpalais has become a destination for sophisticated gastronomy.

A sanctuary for wellbeing awaits on Floor 5, featuring energising yoga programmes. The indoor pool, spa treatments and aqua fitness centre rejuvenate both body and mind. In keeping with grand hotel tradition, the Taschenbergpalais upholds a service culture defined by exceptional standards.

The expansive lobby, directly connected to the pâtisserie and lounge, has been reimaged in sophisticated splendour. Elegant design elements, contemporary artworks and a stylised interpretation of the Elbe River lend a distinctive character to the space. Warm sandstone flooring, earthy tones and vibrant accents create an inviting, dynamic atmosphere. A spirit of connection flourishes here, where guests share stories and create lasting memories. The fireplace areas infuse the space with a cosy charm, inviting evening relaxation. These intimate corners provide the perfect setting to enjoy the hotel's distinctive ambience. Three newly installed doors connect the lobby to the inner courtyards, expanding the sense of space and flooding the area with natural

light. Guests can experience the baroque beauty of the outdoors from within. Art plays a central role in the lobby, where the history of the Taschenbergpalais is brought to life in imaginative ways. Countess Cosel is depicted in multiple artistic interpretations, from classical paintings to modern forms such as spray and pop art, each adding a unique dimension to the space. A dedicated private lounge now hosts the concierge and the Lady in Red. Here, guests receive discreet and personalised service, from curated recommendations for local experiences to the fulfilment of special requests. 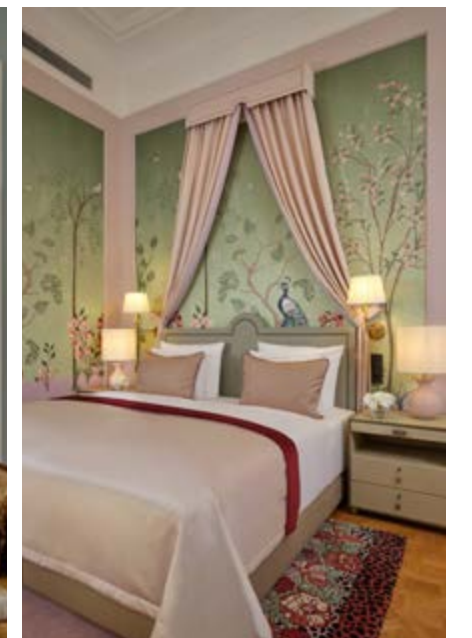
QUEEN AND KING UNITED

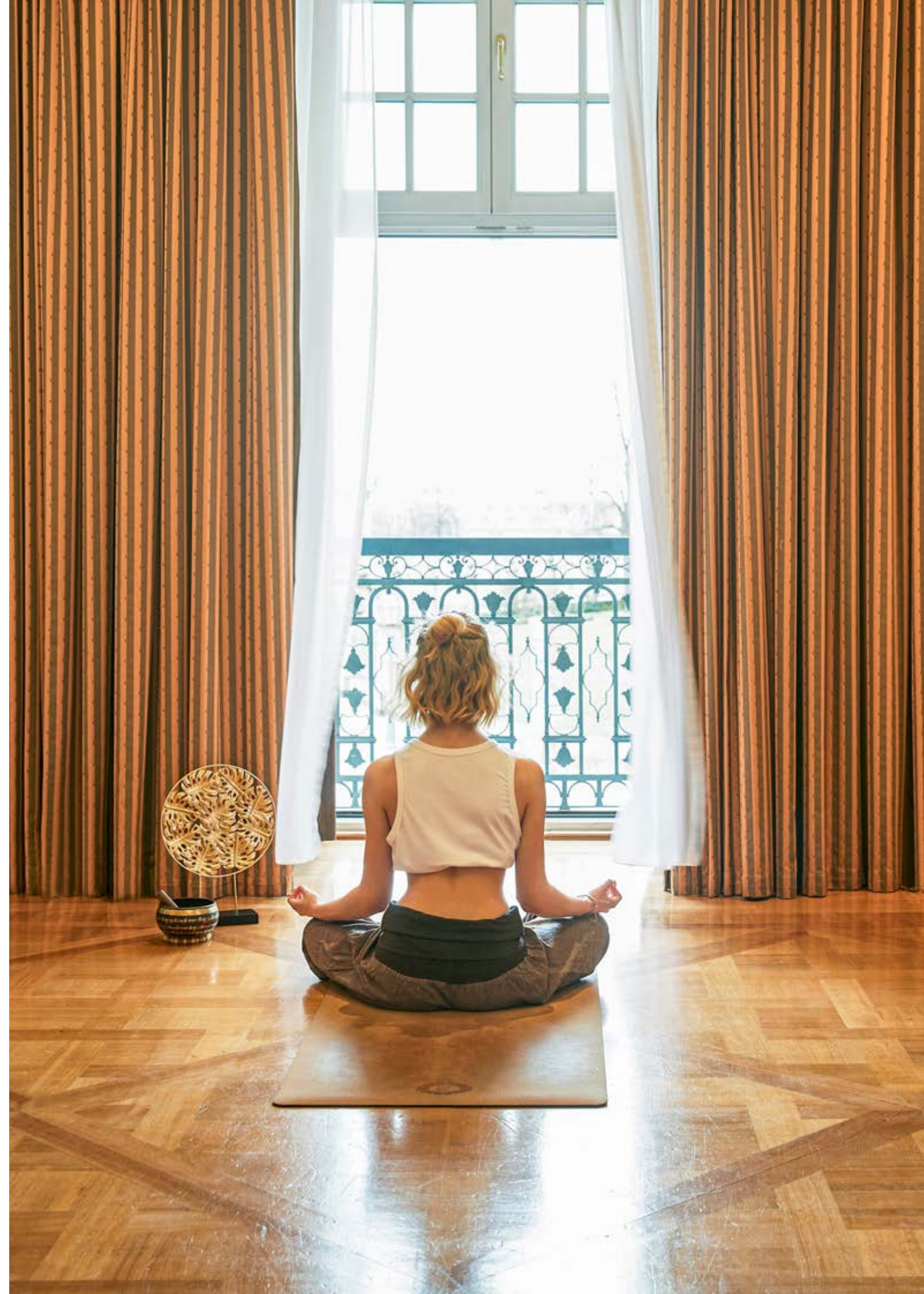
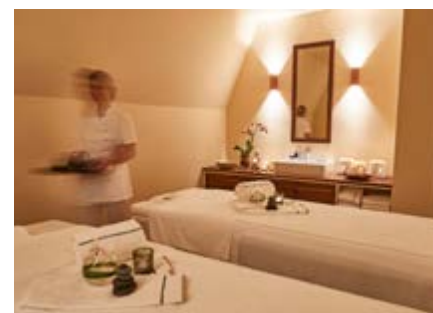

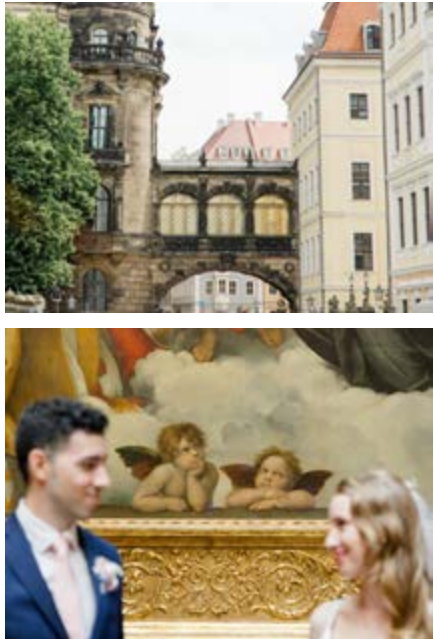
